This letter is in response to an abusive telephone call that has been left by an individual from your office and placed to the number listed above. Please be advised the telephone call was recorded and may later be presented as evidence demonstrating your company's poor procedures and lack of professionalism.

Let this letter serve as formal notice that a fraudulent account has been opened and a previous collection agency has been notified of such. Furthermore, repeated certified letters have been sent to previous collection agencies advising that this debt is not valid and strictly prohibiting any future contact. It appears your company has been duped into collecting on assignment for this fraudulent debt and your decided course of action has been to contact the phone number listed above.

This letter is formal notice that you are prohibited from any future contact regarding this fraudulent debt.
